The Whitko Career Academy hosted an open house, ribbon cutting ceremony, and recognition banquet at their campus located in Larwill, IN, on Saturday, October 10, 2020. Beginning at 3 p.m., the WCA was open to the general public. Guests were able to tour the newly renovated facility on their own or with a Whitko faculty or staff member. At 5:30 p.m., the WCA held the official ribbon cutting ceremony, and at 7 p.m., 250 guests were welcomed to the dinner and banquet.

OPEN HOUSE

Guests viewed the exciting new changes to come to the Larwill campus at Whitko's Career Academy which include the Advanced Manufacturing Lab featuring state-of-the-art CNC machinery, the nursing wing with two separate labs, the welding wing that allowed guests the opportunity to try virtual reality welding simulators, and the Ag facility which contains a livestock area and a show ring.

Welcome to the Whitko Career Academy

CREATING OPPORTUNITY CLOSE TO HOME

The WCA offers an extraordinary educational environment and has created additional opportunities for students within the Whitko Community School Corporation.

WCA students will take a concentrated sequence of courses in a chosen career field in order to give them a jump-start on their future. Students benefit from hands-on, real-world learning experiences while meeting and learning from mentors in the workforce. Additional benefits include opportunities to earn college credit while in high school, the option to work during school hours, and the ability to gain experience that will attract future employers.

The Jr High Experience is for all eighth grade students and offers class rotations of *Intro to Agriculture*, *Preparing for College & Careers*, and *Intro to Engineering & Design/PLTW*.

The WCA allows ninth grade students to choose one of three Academies: *Agriculture*, *Public Service*, or *Skilled Trades*.

Additional Career Focus classes offer sophomore through senior students the opportunity to choose a more concentrated area of study in *Advanced Manufacturing*, *Agriculture*, *Business Education & Marketing*, *Construction Trades*, *Cosmetology*, *Criminal Justice*, *Culinary Arts*, *Early Childhood Education*, *Education Professions*, *Engineering & Design/PLTW*, *First Responders*, *Health Science*, *Precision Machining*, or *Welding Technology*.

GENEROUS GRANT FUNDING

The invaluable partnerships with the 80/20 Foundation Trust and the Community Foundation of Whitley County paved the way for an exciting future for our school district. One year after an initial investment of \$400,000 in 2019 to begin the Whitko Career Academy, the 80/20 Foundation Trust, led by John Wood and the Board of Directors, decided unanimously to invest an additional \$2,433,877 in the future of manufacturing.

Whitko Community Schools used the grant funding for renovations to the Larwill Campus and investments in technology that have propelled the Career Academy toward success in courses focused in engineering and skilled trades. Expenses of the project included nearly \$1 million in machine and welding equipment and tools, and \$300,000 to fund necessary teaching staff and support positions. Meanwhile, another \$1 million of the grant has been directed toward site renovations including an Advanced Manufacturing Laboratory, entrance lobby to the AML, and AML tool crib.

The WCA partnership with the 80/20 Foundation Trust has led the way to new funding and new partnerships. With additional donors slated to contribute, the initial investment continues to provide momentum for the school's goals to become reality.

A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

Q. How will the WCA be sustained?

A. The WCA is filling a huge void recognized at the state and federal level. To encourage schools to fill this void, Career and Technical Education (CTE) dollars have been set aside and are given to schools who train students to meet the country's demand in trades and skilled labor needs.

Q. What is the participation at the WCA?

A. Approximately 70% of students in grades 10-12 have chosen to take classes at the WCA.

Q. Were taxes raised to create the WCA?

A. No, funding came from donors. In addition, taxes were already set for 2020 (at a lower rate than 2019) when the WCA opened.

Q. Will taxes be raised to sustain the WCA?

A. No, funding will come from CTE money the school receives for students taking the WCA classes. In 2019, the tax rate was 1.2210. In 2020, the tax rate has been lowered to 1.1463, and will drop again in 2021, as Whitko is operating under budget for the 2020 calendar year.

DEDICATED STAFF

A dedicated set of staff interact daily with enthusiastic students, welcoming them to the WCA. The instructors and students work together to create a culture of high expectations in every classroom and throughout the school. Along with supportive parents, the students and staff have already made Whitko Career Academy a thriving location for furthering education, and a natural progression for the exciting future of our district. ●

CHILD CARE SERVICES

BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Whitko Career Academy proudly offers before and after school care for students pre-k and up. Before school care drop off begins at 6:30 a.m. and after school pick up ends at 5:30 p.m. Students are taken to school in time for morning breakfast and are provided an after school snack at WCA. Before and after school care is \$25 per week, per child. Care in either the morning or afternoon only is just \$15 per week, per child. Enrollment is ongoing.
